### **Summary**

Are you interested in joining a small, uniquely-focused faculty to work together to educate students and tackle society's most pressing health care problems? The College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Health Sciences and Pharmacy in St. Louis (UHSP) is hiring a cluster of faculty focused on health disparities and social determinants of health to support our new health science undergraduate academic programs, including the Applied Behavioral Sciences and Biopsychology degrees, which are housed in the Department of Liberal Arts.

We are looking for an academic year, tenure track faculty position in Sociology with equal research (40%) and teaching responsibilities (40%) with the remainder being dedicated towards service, including service to the University and community (20%) to begin in Fall 2023. Primary responsibilities include teaching core sociology classes, including introduction to sociology and medical sociology, as well as developing new electives related to the candidates area of specialization. The teaching load is three courses per semester. Faculty are expected to engage in research leading to publication with the potential for generating external grant funding. We are particularly interested in a sociology scholar with a primary specialty area related to health disparities and/or the social determinants of health. Opportunities exist for collaboration with current faculty members, as well as potential involvement with the Center for Interprofessional Practice and Education (CIPE), a health professions education collaboration between UHSP, Washington University School of Medicine, and Goldfarb School of Nursing. Finally, the ideal candidate should have experience and/or interest in participating on faculty committees and advising students and student organizations.

### **Qualifications**

To be successful in this role you will need:

- A Ph.D. in sociology or closely related discipline by time of appointment
- Teaching and/or research specialization in medical sociology
- Experience teaching (which can include graduate teaching assistantships) core undergraduate sociology courses, such as introduction to sociology, medical sociology, and/or research methods

- A willingness to teach in an ability-based education model using active, student-centered learning
- An active scholarly research program in medical sociology with a focus on studying health disparities and/or the social determinants of health
- Demonstrated support for diversity and inclusion, and the ability to incorporate diversity, cultural competency, and social justice into teaching, research and/or service

#### Preferred Qualifications:

- Ability to mentor student scholarship by supervising undergraduate student research projects
- Experience with interdisciplinary or collaborative research
- Experience participating in local, state, and/or national professional organizations
- Experience working with students from diverse backgrounds
