Position Summary/Purpose of Position:	The Department of Sociology invites applications for a professional track faculty member at the level of Lecturer. This is a 9-month, full-time position. The successful candidate will assist with the instruction, development, and delivery of undergraduate courses in Sociology. Responsibilities include: 1) teaching three courses in each of the fall and spring semesters; 2) working with the Director of Undergraduate Studies to develop new curriculum of interest to Sociology majors and minors; and 3) participation on departmental committees, as assigned.
Minimum Qualifications:	A PhD in sociology or a closely related discipline. A strong commitment to teaching excellence is required.
Preferences:	Although we will consider candidates with a range of substantive specialties, we are especially interested in candidates who would be able to teach courses in the sociology of health, illness, and/or medicine.

Additional Information:	Applicants should provide a CV, cover letter, statement of teaching philosophy, and a list of three references. The initial contract will begin August 2022 with an initial length of two years, with the possibility of renewal. Professional track faculty positions do not count toward or lead to tenured or tenure-track positions at University of Maryland, but do include a promotion ladder. Professional track instructional faculty play a crucial role in the academic life of the department.
